LITTLE TOKYO PROPERTY-BASED BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT PRINCIPLES AND PROCEDURES

- Guiding Principle: The work of the Little Tokyo Business Improvement
 District ("LTBID") Advisory Committee is to fulfill the organization's mission: To
 provide improvements and special services designed to enhance the
 business climate of the area.
- Property ownership: Advisory Committee members must be property owners within the district in order to be representative of those persons who will be assessed and be proponents of the LTBID.
- Representation: The Advisory Committee is expected to guide and implement the LTBID's management plan, as accepted and approved by the stakeholders. The Advisory Committee is accountable to the district's property owners, and its goals must align with the district's stated objectives, including to provide guidance and leadership within the commercial area to ensure the highest probability for success of the LTBID.
- Potential conflicts of interest: An LTBID Advisory Committee member has a fiduciary duty to act in the best financial interests of the district. Any individual member who actively seeks to undermine the LTBID's purpose could be seen as having a conflict of interest that makes him/her ineligible to serve on the committee.
